### Parents Assembly

We would like to appreciate the large number of parents/guardians who attended the Parents' Assembly on 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2018. We appreciate the contributions made during the discussion, and the school will always

endeavour to implement resolutions passed during such meetings.

### Consultation day

The Consultation Day Programme for non-candidate classes was conducted on 20<sup>th</sup> May 2018. Parents/guardians had the opportunity to meet with the different subject teachers to discuss their children's academic progress. We would like to appreciate the parents/guardians who attended this programme.

### Study Tours

The school organised study tours for different classes & clubs during the course of second term. The Senior 6 & Year 13 classes made a study tour of the Rwanda Revenue Authority, Rwanda Development Board and the National Bank of Rwanda institutions, while the Senior 3 and Year 11 classes toured the Ntaruka Hydro electric power station before proceeding to Rubavu where they made a study of Lake Kivu beach and river Sebeya. This year the History Club visited the Musanze caves, where they learnt much about the historical significance of the caves. These study tours will help our students to apply the knowledge they learnt in class to the real world.

### Open Day

The School's Annual Open Day was conducted on 17<sup>th</sup> June 2018. There was a variety of displays by different departments in the school. The attendance by our parents/guardians was good and they appreciated the high quality of displays that were made by students.

### Kwibuka 24

As part of the activities to mark the Commemoration of the 24<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the 1994 Genocide against the Tutsi;

students and staff had a “Walk to Remember” to the Ntarama Memorial Site on Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> May 2018. There were more than 100 students and a good number of their teachers who were involved in the walk. This was a culmination to a week-long commemoration programme from 21<sup>st</sup> – 27<sup>th</sup> May 2018, where guest speakers addressed students on various topics related to Commemoration of the Genocide against the Tutsi in Rwanda. The students and staff took up a project to renovate a house of a widow who is a genocide survivor. After renovating the house, they bought furniture for the seating room and bedroom and further provided her with basic groceries.

#### **Presentations:**

**Dr Shyaka Mugabe:** Explained what genocide is in comparison to other mass killings & how it happened in Rwanda.

**Ahishakiye Naphtali:** Discussed how Rwanda as a nation is fighting the consequences of the 1994 Genocide against the Tutsi.

**Rudasingwa Jean Pierre:** A genocide survivor gave a testimony of what happened in Ruhanga during the genocide; he was 8 years old when all his family members got killed.

**Hon Bamporiki Edward:** Gave an address on Unity & Reconciliation in Rwanda.

**Hon. Min Francis Kaboneka:** The climax of the Genocide Commemoration Week was on 27<sup>th</sup> May, 2018, when Hon. Min Francis Kaboneka addressed the Nu-Vision High

School community about events leading to genocide; Pre-Colonial, Colonial, Post-Colonial history of Rwanda. He also explained how a section of Rwandans sacrificed a lot to stop genocide.

#### **Week of Spiritual Emphasis**

The week of spiritual emphasis for this term was conducted from 18<sup>th</sup> – 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2018. Our guest was Mr Saya Jackson, a motivational speaker and preacher from Nairobi, Kenya. His messages were quite uplifting to both our students and staff. The school appreciates Mr Saya for accepting the call to come and minister to the youth in this institution.

#### **Music Sabbath**

The Seventh Annual Music Sabbath was conducted on 7<sup>th</sup> July 2018. This year we had choirs from Gahogo and Gitwe Adventist High schools, Send us God Choir, Shalom Singers, The Redeemed and Didier. Our local choir, the Light Way choir and soloists made presentations on this day. We wish to extend our appreciation to the Chaplaincy department and all who participated in the programme to make it a success.

#### **Sports**

Our sports week this term ran from 9<sup>th</sup> – 13<sup>th</sup> July 2018. Students competed in track and field events, soccer, lawn tennis and basketball. The climax was the Sports Day on 13<sup>rd</sup> July 2018, where final games were played.

The overall winner during this year’s Sports Day was Rhino House. The winning house was awarded with a trophy, and athletes who excelled in individual events were awarded with an array of medals, ranging from Gold, Silver and Bronze respectively.

Parents/guardians are requested to ensure that all children who are above 16 years old apply for National Identity cards. The National ID cards are used when a student is registering for A' Level examinations.

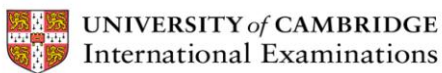
### 7. School uniforms
