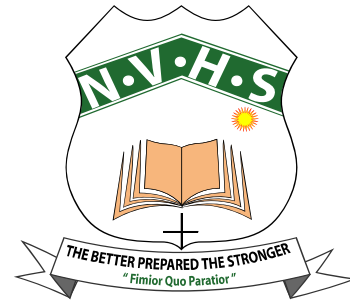


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PARENTS NEWS LETTER: 5th April, 2019

Announcements

- **Requirements for Registration**

To register for National Examinations, the following documents are required:

Senior 3: School reports for senior 1 & 2

Senior 6: Senior 3 result slip, school reports for senior 4 & 5 and National ID. These documents must be brought to school on opening day of second term.

- **Beginning of Term Tests**

Beginning of term tests will start as soon as students are back in school on 29th April, 2019. Students are expected to report back to school on time so that they sit for these tests, those who report late shall not be allowed to do these tests.

- **School uniforms:**

Parents/guardians must ensure that their children's uniforms are not altered in any way. Students who alter uniforms (Tight trousers & shirts & short skirts) will be requested to buy new ones before being allowed in school next term.

- **Girls' hair**

Girls are expected to maintain the policy on hair styles. Only black braids and black hair bands are allowed in school.

- **Water Bottles**

Each student is expected to bring a water bottle to use to store drinking water. This is to avoid students sharing water from the same bottle which leads to spread of diseases.

- **Visitation Day Programme**

Parents/guardians are reminded that the Visitation Day programme runs from **9:00am up to 4:00pm**. This timetable must be strictly adhered to; the school gate will be closed for any entry after 4:00pm. Parents are reminded to carry Visitation Cards when they visit their children.

- **Doctors' appointments**

Children can only be taken home for routine doctor's appointments from **Monday up to Wednesday**. Parents/guardians are also advised that the school does not receive students coming from home during the week-end.
